History of Gay Rights

Stonewall 1969

Bar in Greenwich Village where gay men congregated Laws in NYC against gay people congregating in public

The Stonewall Riots in 1969 is regarded as a catalyst for the LGBT movement for civil rights Inspired LGBT people to organize in support of gay rights,

Gay rights groups every major city in the United States.

Gay Pride Parade celebrates Stonewall

Transwomen who called themselves drag queens (the term transgender was not used in the 1960s') were active at Stonewall.

For much of history, trans people and people of color excluded from gay rights movement Two trans women of color were present at Stonewall:

Marsha P. Johnson was an outspoken African American trans rights/gay rights/AIDS activist, sex worker, and drag queen during the late 20th century.

Sylvia Rivera of Venezuelan and Puerto Rican descent, and worked as a trans rights/gay rights activist and drag queen around the same time.

Marsha and Sylvia co-founded the organization STAR, or Street Transvestite Action Revolutionaries, a group dedicated to helping homeless young drag queens and trans women of color. They dedicated their lives to the fight for equality.

Anita Bryant

Within 10 years religious right "Moral Majority"
Begins working on repealing advances in gay rights
Anita Bryant controversial figure who leads this movement
Her movement energized the gay rights

Harvey Milk

Visionary civil and human rights leader first openly gay elected officials in the United States when he won a seat on the San Francisco Board of Supervisors in 1977.

His loud and unapologetic proclamation openly gay candidate brought hope to LGBT community. Also evoked hostility from others.

Harvey Milk fought loudly for the rights of all individuals in the LGBT community including trans people, and *lesbians*.

Urged all gay people men and women to come out and fight for their rights.

Milk and Mayor George Moscone were assassinated by former supervisor Dan White.

May 22 as a day of "special significance" in his honor.

Congressman Rep. Barney Frank first openly gay member of Congress.

Introduced the Employment Non-Discrimination Act, h prohibits employers from discriminating based on someone's sexual orientation or gender identity. The bill did not pass. Frank retired in January 2013 after serving for 16 My terms as a Democratic representative from Massachusetts.

Tammy Baldwin

First openly gay women elected to US Senate in 2012

AIDS 1980s

Gay advocacy groups reacted to govt slow response to link AIDS to gay men

Government blocks research and treatment to the epidemic. Mobilization of gay rights now matter of life and death.

Gay civil rights pushed to increase funding for research and education and to win protection against discrimination.

A personal and social tragedy of immense proportions, AIDS paradoxically strengthened the political arm of the gay movement.

Don't Ask Don't Tell

In 1993 President Bill Clinton enacted "don't ask, don't tell," a policy preventing gays from openly serving in the military.

Under it, an estimated 13,000 people were expelled from the U.S. Armed Forces. President Barack Obama repealed the policy in 2011.

Boy Scouts Ban Gays

In 2000 the Supreme Court rules that the Boy Scouts of America can bar gay Scouts and leaders from membership, saying that as a private youth organization it has the right to do so. *In 2013 the ban was lifted.*

Girl Scouts

In contrast the girls scouts never banned girls who identify as lesbians from being members

In 2007, GSUSA honored 18-year-old Girl Scout Madeline as a National Young Woman of Distinction for her project promoting awareness to the intolerance shown to the LGBT community. This is the highest award given by GSUSA.

2009: Hate Crimes Prevention Act

Obama signs into law the Matthew Shepard and James Byrd, Jr. Hate Crimes Prevention Act, named for two victims of hate crimes.

Shepard 21 years old tortured and killed in Laramie, Wyo., because he was gay.

Byrd, a 49-year-old black man chained to back of a truck dragged to death in Jasper, Texas.

Law requires FBI to track hate crimes on gender and gender identity

Department of Justice power to prosecute crimes that were motivated by the victim's race, religion, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity or disability.

Justice Kennedy writing for the majority:

"No longer may this liberty be denied," Justice Anthony M. Kennedy wrote for the majority in the historic decision. "No union is more profound than marriage, for it embodies the highest ideals of love, fidelity, devotion, sacrifice and family. In forming a marital union, two people become something greater than once they were."

Marriage is a "keystone of our social order," Justice Kennedy said, adding that the plaintiffs in the case were seeking "equal dignity in the eyes of the law."

Lesbian Feminism

Emerged in the 1960s and 1970s in response to women's liberation movement Lesbian movement was initially ignored by feminist movement Was viewed as sexual rather than political issue Groups such as Radicallesbians

Rita Mae Brown ardent feminist who brought attention to the rights of lesbians Helped author the ten paragraph manifesto "Instrumental in the Woman Identified Woman"

Rejected definition of woman as tied to male power and relationship and asserted the idea of women defined in relation to each other.

Only women can give women a new sense of self

Not enough to protest gender inequality. Support primacy of women in relation to women.

More radical view that true lesbian relationship was more true feminism since it rejected male domination and patriarary.

At Second Congress To Unite Women in May 1970 Rita Mae Brown grabbed the mic to express anger at the exclusion of lesbian women from feminist movement

Many heterosexual feminists were not comfortable with this view. Caused split in feminism movement.

Lesbian Movement in Los Angeles (1970-1979)

Rich history in the lesbian movement during this time

Lesbian groups formed focusing on unique issues of lesbian.

Prior to Stonewall lesbian culture focus one bar, private homes and softball fields

Organization led to women focused cultural productions and spaces

The Lesbian Tide (Independent lesbian feminist magazine)

Debates emerged over feminist opposition to monogamy butch/feminism

At this time the lesbian movement joined with gay men and challenge homophobia (male and female.

Seattle Lesbian Movement 1970s

YWCA in Seattle became a catalyst for development of new lesbian instructions.

Broke away from Gay Liberation Movement and formed Gay Women's Alliance Published rationale in Publication Pandora

"For as long as women have been struggling against the male-domination prevalent in our society, lesbians have been the niggers of the women's movement. Women's liberation has been running scared in fear of the labels 'lesbian' and 'dyke' hurled by men trying to quell the rise of self-determination among women. And, for the most part, women have reacted defensively, and have put down their gay sisters in order to appear valid in men's eyes. But our common goal, as women, must be to write our own definition of woman and womanhood [...]

Gender identity, an individual's self-conception as being male or female, as distinguished from actual biological sex. For most persons, <u>gender</u> identity and biological characteristics are the same.

Gender identity is not fixed at birth; both physiologic and social factors contribute to the early establishment of a core identity, which is modified and expanded by social factors as the child matures.

Transgender: persons whose gender identity varies from biological sex at birth. In its original and narrower sense, *transgender* referred to males and females who respectively gender-identify as females and males.

In broader sense transgender are persons whose gender identities incorporate behaviors and traits traditionally associated with the opposite sex.

Transgender persons may include transsexuals who undergo sex reassignment

Trans genderists: Persons who gender-identify with the opposite sex but who choose not to undergo sex-reassignment surgery or hormone treatments. May also include androgynes (biologically or psychologically androgynous persons.

Transgender is closely related to the more-recent term *genderqueer*, which is self-applied by persons who are either transgender or who have no gender, a third (neither male nor female) gender, or a fluctuating gender.

Transsexuality: person believes that he or she belong to the opposite <u>sex</u>. The transsexual male born with normal female genitalia and other secondary characteristics of the feminine sex; very early in life, identifies with men and behaves in a manner appropriate to the male sex. His orientation is generally one of attraction to other females.

Gender Reassignment:

Development of successful surgical techniques and hormone therapy, several thousand transsexuals, male and female, have undergone permanent gender reassignment.

Male to Female: Although both male and female transsexuals exist, the male-to-female operation is more common because the genital reconstruction is more successful. The individual's penis and testes are removed, and an artificial vagina is created; breast implants may be inserted, although some breast development usually is promoted with the use of feminizing hormones.

Female-to-male transsexuals may undergo mastectomy and hormone treatments to produce the male secondary sexual characteristics, but attempts to create an artificial penis have not been particularly satisfactory.

Bisexuality

Bisexuality is individual whose attractions are not limited to one sex. Open and inclusive that describes a diverse group of people with a wide variety of experiences around same-sex and different-sex attractions.

As a scientific term, bisexual is not just an identity label; it is also a sexual orientation that can describe a set of behaviors.

Labels like *pansexual*, *polysexual*, *omnisexual*, and *ambisexual* also describe a person with homosexual and heterosexual attractions, and therefore people who have chosen those labels are also bisexual.

Media often portrays bisexuality as individua's who pursue sexuality only for carnal pleasure.

Bisexuality is underrepresented in TV and other mass media.
